What is Safeguarding?

2 Elements:

Child Protection

Part of safeguarding and promoting welfare. This refers to the activity that is undertaken to protect specific children who are suffering, or are likely to suffer, **significant** harm

Safeguarding

Every adult's responsibility to protect all children from harm.
